

# 2004 STUDENT BROADCAST SHORT COURSE

The National Association of Black Journalists, a 29-year-old organization with over 3000 members, is offering a three-day seminar designed to acquaint African American college students with behind-the-scenes jobs in the broadcast industry. **The NABJ Student Broadcast Short Course** is aimed at encouraging more African American journalism students to pursue television management as a career. The project will give students access to African Americans who currently work as news directors, producers, writers, assignment editors, directors and the like, at some of the top television stations in the country, as well as give them hands-on experience and a practical understanding of what these jobs entail.

## QUALIFICATIONS

The seminar will take place on the campus of North Carolina A&T University in Greensboro, North Carolina March 24-27, 2004. The seminar is open to African American juniors and seniors enrolled in a four-year accredited college or university with a declared major in broadcast journalism or communication and a cumulative grade point average of 2.5. **You must attach your latest college transcript and a resume with this application. Applications are due Tuesday, February 10, 2004.**
