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The Oklahoma Writing Project is sponsored by the University of Oklahoma, Jeannine Rainbolt College of Education and the National Writing Project.



The Oklahoma Writing Project, an affiliate of the National Writing Project, is a network of university-school programs dedicated to improving the quality of composition instruction in elementary and secondary schools. The National Writing Project has been honored by the American Associations for Higher Education and the Carnegie Foundation for the Advancement of Teaching "as an outstanding and nationally significant example of how schools and colleges can collaborate to improve American Education." The National Writing Project now includes more than 200 sites in all 50 states, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico and the U.S. Virgin Islands.

The Oklahoma Writing Project celebrates good teachers and good teaching. Teachers from elementary through college levels and from all subject areas who have had success teaching writing learn in summer institutes held at the University of Oklahoma to conduct in-service workshops in Oklahoma schools. Since the inceptions of OWP in 1978, more than 300 teachers have attended summer institutes and more than 3,500 in-service workshops have been held in schools across the state of Oklahoma.

The Oklahoma Writing Project is sponsored by the University of Oklahoma, the Jeannine Rainbolt College of Education and The National Writing Project.

Rationale:

The Oklahoma Writing Project (OWP) is a statewide network of teacher in-service programs directed by and serving teachers of all grade levels, preschool through university and devoted to improving the teaching of writing in Oklahoma schools.

Working from a firm belief in the power of classroom experience and knowledge the OWP employs as Teacher Consultants (TC's) teachers who have participated in the OWP Invitational Summer Institute. Through the school year, TC's conduct workshops in district-sponsored in-service programs designed to meet the particular needs of the attending teachers. Each program includes demonstrations, with writing activities, of approaches to teaching writing that are classroom-tested and supported by current theory and research in writing.

OWP's general aim in planning school-year programs is to offer series of workshops for a total of 15-21 hours. Typically, series consist of three-hour workshops scheduled after school or on Saturday over several weeks or a full year. Some schools may even schedule several full days of workshops during the summer. Districts may suggest other formats to meet their needs.

All school-year in-service programs are fully funded by the schools receiving in-service. Several OWP programs are approved for graduate credit through Oklahoma Continuing Education, specifically the 15-hour, 21-hour and 30-hour programs. Usually these series consist of 3-hour workshops. In these cases, the sponsoring school or district pays for all direct program costs; graduate credit may be available by individual choice for those participants who wish to pay graduate tuition.

Assumptions:

The Oklahoma Writing Project's staff development program is based on the following assumptions.

- 1. The goal of writing excellence is shared by both universities and schools. This common goal can best be reached through collaboratively planned university-school programs.
- 2. Student writing can be improved by helping teachers improve the teaching of writing, and the best teacher of teachers is another teacher.
- 3. Change can best be accomplished by thoughtful programs designed and implemented by those who work in the schools rather than by one-time consultants and packets of teacher-proof materials.
- 4. Programs deigned to improve the teaching of writing should involve teachers at all grade levels and from all subject areas.
- 5. Classroom practice and research have generated a substantial body of knowledge on the teaching of writing.
- 6. Because practicing teachers can conduct useful studies in their classrooms, the institutions of Teacher-Consultants can be a productive guide for field-based research.

Program Formats:

Oklahoma Writing Project Teacher Consultants have used and designed a variety of program formats, all of which allow for teachers to work with each other over time:

- 5, 7, or 10 session series after school, sometimes with sessions ever week, sometimes with sessions every other week or once a month
- 5-session series (or more) on Saturday mornings
- Potluck-dinner sessions once a month for the school year
- Week-long mini-institutes in the summer before school begins or after the end of the year



What to consider when planning Oklahoma Writing Project In-Service:

The content of in-service programs varies greatly because we try to design programs that suit a school's particular needs. Questions to consider in deciding on general content and specific presenters:

- ⇒ Which grade levels will be represented?
- ⇒ Have teachers had much in-service in writing? If so, what was the focus?
- ⇒ Is the audience English/Language Arts teachers or teachers of other subject areas (which ones?) or mixed?
- ⇒ Are the student test data guiding In-Service topics?

Often series have topical focus such as the following:

- > Strategies for teaching a process of approach to writing
- ➤ Integrating writing with literature and/or oral language
- ➤ Writing to learn in all subject areas
- ➤ Connecting writing instruction with the Oklahoma PASS skills and writing assessment
- Adapting a process approach to writing for target groups of students—at risk, English language learners, special needs, emergent writers,
- ➤ Building a community of writers in the classroom
- ➤ Integrating technology into the writing classroom
- ➤ Creating Writing continuums/benchmarks for your school
- ➤ Learning the Six Traits of Writing

With over 100 workshops available, there is plenty of variety, so schools could hold inservice programs with the same general focus year after year. We will let you know what workshops are available and which TC's will be most effective for your needs.

Anytime you have a question or need assistance in determining needs, contact us. Frequently, the Co-Director of In-service and District/School Site contact have several conversations about how to put together a strong series focusing on the site's needs.

Connecting Reading and Writing

Title: Understanding Story Elements--The Project Way

Grade Level: Grades 3rd through 5th

Brief Description: Participants will learn how to motivate through creative projects that enhance student experiences with text. Inspire imagination, while enriching the understanding of characters, settings, and plots. Students of all ages love expressing their learning with special projects and celebrations for sharing.

Grade Level: Grades 3rd through 5th, Grades 6th through 8th

Brief Description: How Novel is Your Writing? Novels provide a plethora of prompts for writing in every genre. Easy to read novels will be included in this presentation.

Grade Level: Grades 6th through 8th

Brief Description: "Why Do I Write?" is full of a variety of fun and creative ways to involve students in writing activities which can easily be incorporated into any classroom using what students are already reading in class. Short stories can lead students to writing free verse poetry, while novels provide an opportunity to write letters of advice, create late breaking news stories, write narrative poems, produce propoganda brochures, and do some investigative reporting. And when March Madness begins, here's a wonderful way to engage students in using figurative language, facts and opinions and research while reading and writing about the NCAA Basketball Tournament! Connecting Reading and Writing

Grade Level: Grades 6th through 8th, Grades 9th through 12th

A variety of classroom tested activities will be presented which engage students in interactive lessons and meet the Oklahoma PASS objectives. Students will develop critical thinking skills, cognitive awareness, and will improve writing and reading skills. Modifications are easily made for individual, small group, large group, and entire class instruction, including lessons for remedial and gifted. This presentation easily adapts for any grade level.

Poetry

Title: Writing Poetry

Grade Level: Grades 6th through 8th, Grades 9th through 12th

Brief Description: Poems are works of art, perfect gifts, and written pieces that show mastery of figurative language and concise word usage. However, students often stare at the blank page when they hear, "Write a poem." Teachers can alleviate this writer's block when they learn how to introduce poetry and use exercises that trigger specific details to make a poem both personal and universal. Objectives include helping students meet the following Oklahoma Priority Academic Student Skills:

Reading/Literature: Standard 3.3 Figurative Language and Sound Devices - a. Identify and use figurative language such as analogy, hyperbole, metaphor, personification, and simile. b. Identify and use sound devices such as rhyme, alliteration, and onomatopoeia. Writing/Grammar/Usage and Mechanics:

Standard 1: Writing Process - The student will use the writing process to write coherently. Standard 2:

Modes and Forms of Writing - The student will write for a variety of purposes and audiences using narrative, descriptive, expository, persuasive, and reflective modes. Standard 3: Grammar/Usage and Mechanics - The student will demonstrate appropriate practices in writing by applying Standard English conventions of the revising and editing stages of writing. Work independently and in self-directed work teams to revise and edit.

Title: Bigfoot Meets Great Poets

Grade Level: Grades 6th through 8th, Grades 9th through 12th

Brief Description: Playfulness leads to creativity. It helps us loosen up and shake away that little voice that tells us we can't write. Students will write/play, look at qualities of good poems, and craft several poems of their own.

Publishing

Title: Celebrate the Gift of Writing: Ways to Publish Student Work

Grade Level: Pre-K through 2nd, Grades 3rd through 5th, Grades 6th through 8th

Brief Description: Books don't have to be flat anymore. Just like gifts, books can come in many sizes and shapes. Make your students' writing "real" by publishing their work. Participants will understand the importance of publishing, learn a variety of unique ways to publish student work individually and as a class. Participants will create examples to share with their own class.

Six Traits of Writing

Title: Swinging Into the Six Traits of Writing

Incorporating the Six Traits of Writing Into Your Existing Curriculum

Grade Level: Grades 3rd through 5th, Grades 6th through 8th

Brief Description: This presentation introduces the six traits of writing and how to incorporate them into the classroom. Using Ruth Culham's 6+1 Traits of Writing as a foundation, participants will learn

each of the traits, how to integrate literature, and other classroom strategies

This workshop demonstrates a hands-on, collaborative way to teach the art of persuasive writing in the classroom. Title: Reaping What You Sow: How Seeding the Curriculum With Kernel Sentences Produces a Bumper Crop of Knowledge

Grade Level: Grades 3rd through 5th, Grades 6th through 8th, Grades 9th through 12th

Brief Description: This cross-curricular presentation asks teachers to consider the forest before thinking about the trees. Simply put, the forest is the WAY we know; the trees are WHAT we know. As subject-area teachers, finding a way to show students WHAT they need to know and an easy way to show them HOW to know it would be invaluable. In this workshop, teachers will learn how to use kernel sentences--two to three word sentences--to reveal the foundation elements of a given topic. Teachers will learn how to guide students to create their own kernel sentences and to structure additions to these sentences as their understanding of a given topic deepens.

Grade Level: Grades 6th through 8th

In this presentation, we will cover techniques and specific examples of how to get your students writing in the science and math classrooms.

Brief Description: A picture can get you closer to 1000 poems! Learn about art and artists, practice the process of painting and writing, and take part in a team-building exercise that ends with a product to be proud of.

Title: Writing Across the Curriculum

Grade Level: Grades 6th through 8th, Grades 9th through 12th

Brief Description: Across the curriculum, students write to learn. Because more teachers expect them to produce more written work, they also write more effectively in general. Writing empowers students because it helps them learn, discover, and share their knowledge. This participant-oriented workshop will focus on how to teach writing across the curriculum using the writing process. Writing exercises and assessment techniques will be shared. Objectives include making students better, more self reliant writers who use the writing process to write for a variety of audiences and purposes using a proper form.

This interactive workshop shows interesting methods of teaching grammar for several practical applications.

This interactive workshop explores high-interest writing assignments in all subject areas, including cross-disciplinary assignments, in which teachers of two or more subjects can collaborate.

Writing Across the Curriculum

Title: Reading and Writing: The Foundation for in Content Areas (You can teach an old dog new tricks!)

Grade Level: Grades 6th through 8th, Grades 9th through 12th

Brief Description: Current research in literacy education stresses the importance of both reading and writing for all ages and subject areas. New concepts and vocabulary can be used creatively in diaries, poetry, diagrams, stories, or graphic organizers. These ideas can be adapted for individual or group activities. Using reading and writing can help lead to deeper learning for the varied learning styles and ability levels found in our classrooms every day.

Title: Focused Free Writes in Every Classroom

Grade Level: Grades 9th through 12th, Post high school technology centers

Brief Description: Every teacher is a teacher of writing -- in the content. Only content teachers understand the specific requirements of their field. Focused free writing is a tool for teachers to use to pre-assess, post-assess during instruction, or allow students to self-asses. In focused free writes, the instructor sets the agenda and asks students to reflect on their own learning. After analyzing student responses to prompts, participants will design their own prompts to use in their classroom
