



## Research Experiences for Undergraduates REU Site in Raptor Research Boise State University SUMMER 2016

The **REU Site in Raptor Research** is funded by the **National Science Foundation** and **Boise State University**. REU-Raptor Research is a 10-week summer research program located at Boise State University for undergraduates from anywhere in the US.

The goal of the **REU-Raptor Research** site is to engage undergraduates in biological research using birds of prey (hawks, owls, falcons, and eagles) as model systems.

In addition to the mentored research experience, participants receive (1) \$5,250 stipend, (2) free housing in a residence hall, (3) round-trip travel expenses to Boise, and (4) a food supplement.
