Professors for the Future

The San Diego IRACDA Program at the University of California, San Diego is a NIH/NIGMS-supported Postdoctoral Fellowship Program that provides 3 years of support for mentored postdoctoral training in biomedical research combined with training in educational pedagogy, scientific teaching principles and development of critical academic skills. A 4th year of support may be provided for those fellows that need more training.

Applicants can be either near graduation, new PhDs, MDs, MD/PhDs or postdoctoral fellows with *no* more than ~2 years of training. Must be a <u>U.S Citizen</u> or permanent resident. The program supports fellows engaged in research related to cell biology, biophysics, genetics, developmental biology, pharmacology, physiology, biological chemistry, bioinformatics and computational biology.

The IRACDA program aims to develop a diverse group of highly trained biomedical scientists and 65% of our alumni have successfully obtained faculty positions.

Application Deadline: November 15, 2016

Candidates from underrepresented groups or with disabilities are strongly encouraged to apply.
