

Assistant Professor (Tenure Track) in Developmental, Cell and Molecular Biology in the Department of Biology, Duke University

Position Description

The Department of Biology at Duke University invites applications for a tenure-track faculty position at the Assistant Professor level, to start in July or August 2017. Candidates addressing fundamental questions in the broad area of developmental, cell, and molecular biology (DCMB) are encouraged to apply. We are particularly interested in approaches such as advanced imaging, biochemistry, biophysics, and quantitative methodology.

A successful candidate will be expected to develop an internationally recognized research program, be actively involved in academic activities in the department and the university, and contribute to teaching at undergraduate and graduate levels.

Applicants should have a Ph.D. degree in biological, computational or physical sciences, preferably postdoctoral experience or its equivalent, a strong publication record, the potential to develop a vigorous and well-funded research program, and commitment to undergraduate and graduate teaching. Application should be a single pdf file that includes a cover letter, curriculum vitae, a two-page research summary, a one-page teaching statement, and the names and contact information of three referees.
